### Editor's Note

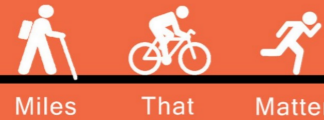

### MOVING FORWARD

Following the Government's announcement concerning the lifting of restrictions from 19<sup>th</sup> July onwards, while we still await guidance from the Diocese and the Bishops of England and Wales, our expectation is that as a Parish we will continue to adopt a cautious approach throughout the Summer.

These are the proposals subject to the awaited guidance:

From 19<sup>th</sup> July to the beginning of September we would ask and strongly encourage all parishioners and visitors to our Churches to continue to wear face masks (unless you have a medical/special reason for not doing so). Hand sanitiser will also remain available for use.

With regard to the seating of people our stewards will continue to allocate seats but depending on attendance levels there may be an increase in the numbers seated on each bench.

Hopefully at the beginning of September we will be able to relax procedures more but will review this at that time.
