

We are expecting all Christmas Masses to have a high attendance and so this will mean that our benches will more than likely be fully occupied without any provision for social distancing so please bear this in mind when choosing which Mass you wish to attend. If you are feeling unsure or vulnerable you may wish to consider joining online and/or attending one of the other Masses during Christmas week. All Masses will be livestreamed.

To try and keep everyone as safe as possible please be mindful of not congregating together and taking time particularly when leaving after Mass to allow the Church to empty slowly. Please also continue to use the hand sanitisers


