PRAYER TO RENEW OUR CHURCH



REFLECT

n Jewish culture, it was the practice for people to decide which rabbi's congregation they decided to join as they identified most closely with that person's interpretation of the scriptures. The unusual aspect of Jesus' gathering of disciples is that he calls them, rather than they presenting themselves to him.

Simon Peter is an important and interesting character in the Gospel tradition. In our episode today, he represents someone confronted with the person of Jesus, who undergoes a profound conversion and change of life. He and the others "left everything and followed [Jesus]". Luke, in his writings, shows a deep suspicion of possessions and riches, seeing them as an obstacle to a proper commitment to Jesus and his teachings. Most of Jesus' disciples were family folk who had to provide for their children, so it is more the judicious use of material goods which is at issue, not the complete renunciation of them – as though that were possible.

Simon Peter is also a sympathetic character who attracts much affection because he is so obviously human. He is

a fallible person who is always getting it wrong, who is guided more by his heart than his head. It is his obvious attachment to Jesus which brings him through in the end. He is "sinful" only in the sense that he acknowledges that he is simply a human being in the presence of the Divine, so in that he is an example of faith and trust for us all.

The abundance of the catch is due to Peter's trust in Jesus.

This has been a bit of an experiment. The editor has tried to make the front and back page of the Sunday Message more legible for those of us with poorer eyesight than others. Therefore parts of the publication have had to be moved (as above)

5. Listening to the Holy Spirit What do you sense the Holy Spirit asking of the Church?

6. The Journeying Companions Who walks with us on our journey of faith? What persons or groups are marginalised? 7. Sharing in the Mission

How can we best share the Good News of Jesus with others? What difference are we currently making?

8. Dialogue in Church and Society In what ways do our parishes/communities speak to each other and the wider society? How could we do this better?

9. With the other Christian Denominations and other faiths How are we as a community listening to, and enriched by, other Christian denominations and other faiths?

10.Authority and Participation

In what ways do we take collective responsibility (priest and lay faithful collaboration) for our community? What are the fruits of this collaboration, and what are the obstacles and challenges?

11.Discerning and Deciding

How do we discern together the direction in which the Holy Spirit is leading us? How can we develop this shared responsibility together?

12.Growing and Journeying Together What support do we need to help us grow as a Church journeying together, listening to each other and the Spirt?

13. Additional Comments Is there anything else you would like to share with us?

The call is to "walk on the same road, together" and to "encounter, listen and discern" With that in mind the Parish will shortly be undertaking the completion of the Synod Questionnaire (see opposite page) To help with the process there will be a whole Parish Meeting for general discussion on Tuesday 8th February 7.30. p.m. to 9.00 p.m.


ROME PILGRIMAGE 21st March 2022
