Building Works at St Joseph's -Update



External Areas and Garden

Unfortunately, there are a some technical issues in respect of the Boundary Wall which have yet to be resolved in consultation with Great Places. This is delaying plans to provide safe and secure access and to develop the garden. It is hoped that the situation will be resolved in the coming weeks.

Dry Rot

The assessment of the extent of Dry Rot (in the sacristy area) and the execution of necessary remedial work has now been completed satisfactorily. The redecoration of the walls is being delayed on economic grounds (see *Redecoration* below).

Essential External Repairs

The contract for this work has finally been awarded and work is due to commence in mid-September. This work is expected to take a maximum of three weeks and should not interfere with the normal use of the church.

Internal Alterations

It remains the intention to:

enlarge the Narthex by installing a new screen further forward in the nave instal kitchenette and Disabled WC facilities at the back of the church reconfigure the confessional area to provide separate spaces for the Parish Priest and Sacristan/Altar Servers

create a new emergency exit adjacent to the present confessional area

A detailed review of requirements has been undertaken and it is expected that we shall shortly be able to invite fresh tenders for this work. The total cost is expected to be well above original estimates due to the changes in market conditions.

Redecoration

In order to reduce expenditure it has been decided that redecoration of the internal walls affected by the Internal Repairs (including the area near the Sacristy) should be undertaken as a separate task after completion of the repairs.

In summary, it will be quite some time before we can expect to see all the planned work completed but a start will be made in mid-September.

An Opportunity to Volunteer

Vinnie Camps have been running for 100 years and take place around the Country organised by Saint Vincent De Paul Society (SVP) volunteers. These camps offer a week of fun, excitement and friendship to boys and girls aged 9 to 12yrs who, for various reasons need a break. It may be due to

family issues such as unemployment, illness, bereavement, or relationship breakdown. The SVP in the Salford Diocese are looking to run a Vinnie Camp in the summer of 2023 in Snowdonia for young people from our area. For this to succeed we need to recruit volunteers willing to undergo training and work with young people throughout the week of the holiday. Volunteers do not need to be members of the SVP and we are looking for men and women aged over 18yrs who have an interest in working with young people. Volunteers must be prepared to have a DBS check (Disclosure and Barring Service) if they do not currently hold a relevant certificate. This is a wonderful opportunity to give young people an experience that they will remember for many years, but it cannot take place without volunteers. 


Folk Night on Saturday 10th September

The Folk Group are holding a **Folk Night on Saturday 10th September** to raise money for Alain Kimolo's Education Project in the Democratic Republic of Congo. Alain was an Asylum Seeker who lived in St Cuthbert's Parish. On his return to the DRC he set up a project to help fund children through one school year. Most of the children helped through the scheme continued with their education when the financial assistance ended. Three of the children who were first supported are now studying at university level.

Because of the pandemic, we have not been able to fundraise for Alain and this year he has been supporting three children through school from his own means. After the St Patrick's night we sent the proceeds from the raffle which, with some donations, came to £200. Alain wrote 'The aid we have just received will help to pay the third term fees for one of

these 3 students. We take this opportunity to express our gratitude and our sincere appreciation the whole parish.'
