Letter from the Parish Leadership Team

Dear Parishioners.

Hopefully you are aware that the Parish has a Leadership Team that have been working together for the last twelve months. Recently we met to review the last year and consider areas of growth and development based on the three priorities we set: to be open to the Holy Spirit, to grow as a family and to bring others to Christ. It soon became apparent that much has taken place and many people have been actively involved thanks be to God.

The existence of the Leadership team (Fr Chris, Olu, Liz, Pauline, and Paul) itself has been a major development in the way the life of the parish is led. The team meets every two weeks to consider all the different areas of parish life and make the necessary decisions to keep the parish moving forward. There are many people who help in different leadership roles in different areas of parish life. This year, new people have taken over the roles of family life coordinator, communications co-ordinator, Eucharistic minister co-ordinator and responsibility for churches together, inter faith dialogue and our Laudato Si garden. We have leaders in our music, baptism programme, sacramental programme, care for funerals, and now Confirmation. Our outreach, which many people are involved in and support, has a co-ordinator and we have a dedicated team working hard in the office giving tremendous admin support. We also have our website, newsletter, and Facebook page to help with communications. We have parishioners taking care of the finance and building matters for the parish. We have good links with our schools promoted by our parishioners. And many other parishioners involved in numerous ways. This is something to recognise and thank God for and the leadership team would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has played a part in any way in the last twelve months.

Looking back over the last year we have been able to pick up on many different parts of parish life after the impact of lockdown. Certainly, since Christmas there has been a gradual return of the majority of our parishioners, and we have been able to celebrate more fully again the liturgical life of the parish. There has been an increase in the number of altar servers, musicians, and readers. The ministry of welcome which was so important during the pandemic has continued and is developing to involve more families. We have been able to celebrate many baptisms, first Holy Communions and prepare the young people for a wonderful celebration of Confirmation by the Bishop at Thornleigh.

One of the recent highlights was the parish Fun Day on the 18th of June which was extremely well attended and had many people involved. As well as raising £5,000 for the Hospice it was a good example that the parish is alive and well!



Folk Night on Saturday 10th September


The Folk Group are holding a

to raise money for Alain Kimolo's Education Project in the Democratic Republic of Congo. Alain was an Asylum Seeker who lived in St Cuthbert's Parish. On his return to the DRC he set up a project to help fund children through one school year. Most of the children helped through the scheme continued with their education when the financial assistance ended. Three of the children who were first supported are now studying at university level.

Because of the pandemic, we have not been able to fundraise for Alain and this year he has been supporting three children through

school from his own means. After the St Patrick's night we sent the proceeds from the raffle which, with some donations, came to £200. Alain wrote 'The aid we have just received will help to pay the third term fees for one of these 3 students. We take this opportunity to express our gratitude and our sincere appreciation the whole parish.'
