

AT THE BEGINNING OF OCTOBER POPE FRANCIS LAUNCHED "THE BIG LISTEN" -

an opportunity for listening and dialogue on the local level in order to discern what the Holy Spirit is saying to the Church in Salford about the next stage of our faith journey.

As an initial step our Parish will be holding two meetings on different days and at different times in each of our churches.

Please pray for the Synod of Bishops Gathering on Synodality, Rome, started October 4th for 3 weeks.

The General Assembly of the Synod on Synodality begins on Wednesday, October 4 2023, following a two-year process that started in September 2021 when the Vatican released a preparatory document and instructions on preparing for the gathering. Hundreds of Catholics from around the world then met in their parishes to discuss the questions posed by the synod. The syntheses of those conversations were then sent to their respective Bishops' Conferences that are tasked with bringing all voices to the table.

Finally, representatives of the episcopal conferences met at the continental level, the final stage before the General Assembly, which itself will take place in two parts, beginning with the gathering in 2023 and concluding with a second meeting in October of 2024.

The Synod will see the participation of 363 voting members, including women. Some participants will be attending as representatives of Bishops' Conferences, others have been appointed personally by Pope Francis, and some will be attending as "fraternal delegates," "spiritual assistants," or "experts and facilitators."

Parish Music

We are fortunate in St Cuthbert's to have a thriving Parish Music group that serves at the 9.30 Mass at St Joseph's and at the 11.15 Mass at St Thomas', and an accomplished organist who serves alternate weeks at the 11.15 Mass.

Pope calls for world day of prayer for peace as catastrophe looms in Gaza

Warning against a humanitarian catastrophe in Gaza and ongoing conflicts elsewhere, Pope Francis has called for a day of fasting, penance and prayer for peace in the world Oct. 27.

"War does not solve any problems, it only sows death and destruction. It increases hatred, multiplies revenge. War erases the future," he said at the end of his general audience talk in St. Peter's Square Oct. 18.

"Our thoughts go to Palestine and Israel," he said to applause.

"Casualties are rising and the situation in Gaza is desperate," he said. "Please, may everything possible be done to avoid a humanitarian catastrophe."

What is also "disturbing," he said, is the possibility the conflict will spread just as so many other battles of war are being waged in the world.

"Please," he said, "let us continue to pray for peace in the world, especially in tormented Ukraine," a tragedy that is no longer talked about but continues.

"Silence the weapons. Listen to the cry of the poor, the people, the children, for peace," the pope said.

He urged all people of faith to take "just one side in this conflict: that of peace. But not with words, with prayer, with total dedication."

For this reason, he said, he has decided to call for a day of fasting, prayer and penance October 27th.

The pope invited men and women of every Christian denomination and other religions as well as those committed to the cause of peace to participate in any way they feel is appropriate.

There will be an hour of prayer starting at 6 p.m. Rome time in St. Peter's "imploring for peace in the world," he said,
